HEAD PROTECTION — 29 CFR 1910.135 / 1926.100

- Assessed for falling or flying object hazards
- Assessed for bump hazards from fixed objects
- Assessed for electrical hazard exposure *If yes: Class E hard hat required*
- Hard hat class selected appropriate to hazard: Class E / G / C *Circle applicable*
- Hard hats inspected regularly — replacement schedule established

EYE AND FACE PROTECTION — 29 CFR 1910.133 / 1926.102

- Assessed for flying particle / chip / dust hazards *Safety glasses with side shields*
- Assessed for chemical splash hazards *Chemical goggles required*
- Assessed for welding / arc hazards *Welding helmet with correct shade*
- Assessed for grinding / chipping hazards *Face shield over safety glasses*
- Prescription eyeglass wearers: OTG safety glasses or prescription safety glasses provided

HEARING PROTECTION — 29 CFR 1910.95

- Noise levels assessed for all work areas
- Areas at or above 85 dBA identified *Hearing conservation program required*
- Hearing protectors (earplugs/earmuffs) provided at no cost to workers in 85+ dBA areas
- NRR rating of selected hearing protector adequate for exposure level
- Annual audiometric testing established for exposed workers

HAND PROTECTION — 29 CFR 1910.138 / 1926.95

- Assessed for cut and abrasion hazards — cut-resistant gloves selected with appropriate ANSI cut level
- Assessed for chemical exposure — glove material verified against SDS Section 8
- Assessed for electrical work — rubber insulating gloves rated for voltage
- Assessed for heat / welding hazards — leather or aluminized gloves as appropriate

FOOT PROTECTION — 29 CFR 1910.136 / 1926.96

- Assessed for falling / rolling object hazards — safety toe footwear required *ASTM F2413*
- Assessed for puncture hazards — PR-rated sole required
- Assessed for electrical hazards — EH-rated footwear required
- Assessed for slip hazards — slip-resistant soles required

RESPIRATORY PROTECTION — 29 CFR 1910.134

- Assessed for airborne hazards: dusts, fumes, vapors, mists, or oxygen deficiency
- If respirators required: written respiratory protection program in place
- Medical evaluations completed before respirator use
- Fit testing completed annually for tight-fitting respirators
